Dear Friends in Christ

Christmas is almost upon us again. How did that happen? But I know it must be true. The vestry is full of items for the Christmas Fair, the candles for the Christmas services have been ordered, the plans are in place to decorate the church and I've even chosen the carols for Christmas Eve.



I'm sure that you too are making plans for Christmas, as that's what Advent is about. At home, I've made the Christmas cake and drawn out my name for the family Secret Santa. I've started shopping and made important decisions about how many pigs in blankets we may need and whether I buy Quality Street or Heroes this year (other sweet treats are available!).

#### W I report

At our Craft demonstration session on Tuesday 12 November, our President showed us how to arrange flowers in a vase and Jenny Roberts demonstrated the making of Christmas wreaths



using seed heads, artificial berries, cones (which can be sprayed), and dried oranges and apples, wired together in groups of three. She also showed us how to make an artificial autumn wreath using leaves and feathers. Jenny stressed that the moss base which is wired round the metal ring must be well dampened. It is also a good idea to use a fairly large ring as a base to avoid overloading the wreath.

Our next meeting on Tuesday 10 December will be our Christmas meeting, when we will enjoy festive refreshments and be entertained with seasonal music from the Alban Duo.

#### **Tributes at Christmas**

I am sure many families will want to place something on their loved one's grave at Christmas time. However, please remember someone also needs to tidy away once Christmas is over.



If you are leaving flowers or arrange-

ments in the **Garden of Rest** by the church, please place them by the central stone and not on the grass or the flower beds. Vases are provided. Items are removed and disposed of once they no longer look their best.

If you are leaving tributes on a grave in the **House Lane Churchyard**, please try to use natural materials, avoiding any lights, candles, glitter, fake snow, polystyrene, etc. One arrangement I noticed two years ago was just some holly and other sprigs of evergreen placed in the metal flower holder on a memorial stone. It lasted for weeks, cost nothing and was fully compostable afterwards.

Last year I noticed quite a few families had adopted this idea. Please feel free to prune the evergreens in either churchyard—the old churchyard in particular has a large holly tree that's usually covered in berries.

If you are personally unable to remove any Christmas tributes once Christmas is over, then we will tidy these away for you and dispose of them. The date we do this will depend on the weather and other tasks that need doing, so if you would like to reclaim your tribute, we ask you do this by **Sunday 26 January** please.

*Yours Ever, Jane* is a witty look at Regency England through the letters and novels of Jane Austen, who wrote long, descriptive letters to her sister Cassandra.


Tickets are £5 for adults, children under 16 are free, with proceeds going to St Leonard's church. Refreshments available in the interval.

#### **CLERK'S REPORTS**

#### **Monthly Accounts**

Members reviewed a schedule of creditor payments for the period 10 October to 13 November 2024. It was unanimously resolved that Members approve payment of this schedule on 15 November 2024.

#### **Standing Orders**

An electronic copy of the Parish Council's Standing Orders was sent to Members on 30 October 2024. After establishing that there were no amendments it was unanimously resolved to re-adopt the Standing Orders for the coming year.

#### ICO Model Publication Scheme

Members reviewed the Information Commissioners Office Model Publication Scheme. It was unanimously resolved to re-confirm the Parish Council's ongoing adherence to the ICO requirements.

# Sandridge Youth and Sports Community Association (SYSCA) Membership

Cllr Reid confirmed her willingness to take the place of Cllr Twidell on the board of this association.

#### **Matters of Note**

- The PACE Officer has received three quotations for a full structural survey of Marshalswick Community Centre as requested by the Council. A contractor will shortly be selected.
- The prolonged power outage at Spencer Meadow has finally been resolved. The street lighting and CCTV are operational again.
- A solution to excessive surface water on the path between The Ridgeway and William Bell Open Space has been agreed with the adjacent householder and works will commence shortly. This expenditure was ratified by the Finance Committee on 28 October 2024.
- The draft 2025/26 Budget and recommended precept increase were presented to the Finance Committee on 28 October 2024. These will appear on the December agenda of Full Council.
- Members are reminded that there will be a public information evening at Marshalswick Community Centre on 14 Nov at 7.30pm to promote the welfare of local birdlife and, in particular, of swifts arriving in the parish from Africa next spring.


