Letter from our Vicar

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

Some years ago we went on a short break to Salzburg in Austria. I remember it was March 2020 – because Austria went into lockdown during our visit! But before that happened, we'd had a lovely few days with our children and their partners. One day the female contingent went on a coach tour of the places featured in the film *The Sound of Music*, which is of course based on the real-life story of the von Trapp family under Nazi occupation. It was great fun, driving from one familiar site to another, drinking lukewarm white wine and singing along to the soundtrack.

That trip reminds me of two things: firstly, that when times are hard we need to think of our favourite things. Not necessarily raindrops on roses, or whiskers on kittens. We all have our favourite things. For some of us, life may be hard for specific reasons - finances, relationships, or health perhaps. For others of us it may be the general sadness caused by the short grey cold days. But all of us can try to think positive thoughts. If you are struggling with that, let me give you one to hold onto. God loves you. He loves you a vast amount and he loves you exactly as you are. He prefers it when you are feeling happy. He doesn't necessarily want you to be in the situation you are in. But whether you are in a good place or not, believe this incredible truth. God loves you.

The second thing the trip reminds me of is the fragility of our lives. That glimpse of life in Austria during World War II, no matter how wrapped up in charming song and dance, reminds us that peace and safety cannot be relied upon. It reminds us that our lives can be turned upside down in a short moment. One day I was on holiday, the next I was returning home, in a mask, in a plane full of apprehension. When times are hard, many of us turn to God in prayer. Perhaps because a problem shared is a problem halved, or because it gives us comfort and hope to talk to such a great listener. And when times are good, it is a joyful thing to acknowledge that and give thanks.

Do remember the church is open every day for personal prayer and you can always leave a prayer on our prayer tree, or take away a suitable prayer from the prayer station. Please also remember that Sundays at 10.00am are a time of shared prayer and thanksgiving and all are welcome. And know that God hears each and every one of our prayers: whether sung in a hymn, whispered in the darkness or sent as an unformed thought.

I pray that 2026 will be a year of peace for you, in which you feel the endless love of Almighty God.

House Lane Churchyard

At this time of year there is generally less maintenance to do in the churchyards. However, one task that happens a month or so after Christmas is a tidy up in the House Lane churchyard to remove Christmas tributes. At the same time there is also a general tidy to remove dead plants, plant pots, broken items, breakable items and so on from the graves. If you would like to retrieve a tribute from a grave then **please do so before Friday 6 February** as, weather and all other things permitting, the clearance will happen on Saturday 7 February. Any offers of help with this are most welcome.

The Diocese has recently released new versions of the Churchyard Regulations 2025 and the Churchyards Handbook: Guide for Families. These are apparently only slightly different from the old versions. Both can be easily accessed via the St Albans Diocesan website, and should also be on our own website too. A paper copy is kept in the church porch.

In summary, there is very little which can be put on a grave in a churchyard apart from living cut flowers and small pot plants. Please do not add or renew any edging or chippings of any kind, which are unauthorised due to the maintenance and safety issues they raise. If you have any queries at all, we'd be most grateful if you could contact us, using the form on our website, before placing something on a grave.

As this magazine is published, we will be coming to the end of the time when people can comment on our application to remove some trees and shrubs from particular graves. You will need to make contact urgently if you feel this affects you in any way. The holly trees are self-seeded and, together with another shrub and a conifer, need to be removed to ensure the graves, and those around them, remain usable in the future.

Lent 2026

It is amazing to think that we are almost in Lent already and turning our faces and our lives towards Easter Sunday, when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Easter is a ‘moveable feast’ and this year falls on Sunday 5 April.

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday**, which this year is **Wednesday 18 February**. Traditionally, we are marked with a cross in ash on our foreheads (a sign of mourning) and these words are used: *“Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ”*

‘Ashing’ is offered on **Ash Wednesday at our 10.00am service** and on the following **Sunday, 22 February, also at 10.00am**. We are marked with a cross in ash to symbolise our intention to live better lives. As the season is one of penitence and reflection, it is hoped we will all think about our lives and how we can improve both who we are and, most importantly, our relationship with God.

This year we have decided on an exciting new development and will be offering the service of **Compline on Sundays throughout Lent** (but not on Mothering Sunday). The dates are:

Sundays 22 February, 1, 8, 22 and 29 March.

The service will start at **4.00pm** and last about half an hour; refreshments will be offered from 3.30pm. Compline is an ancient and beautiful service to close the day and will take place in our even more ancient chancel which will be candle-lit. Each service will include a short reflection on the nature of prayer and the encouragement for us all to find ways to connect with God.

As ever, all are most welcome at these services. No-one is expected to attend every time, to contribute to the service (unless they wish to) or indeed to donate. Compline will simply offer a time of calm within our wonderful church.

CLERK'S REPORTS**6087 Monthly Accounts**

Members reviewed a schedule of creditor payments for the period 11 December 2025 to 14 January 2026. It was unanimously:

To approve payment of the online transfers on this schedule on 16 January 2026 and to ratify the payment of standing charges and debit card payments already made.

6088 Public Toilets in Marshalswick and Sandridge Village

Members discussed an exchange of correspondence between the Clerk and the District Council regarding the continued provision of public toilets in both the village and Marshalswick. The Clerk was asked to write further seeking a resolution to the threatened closure of these facilities. It was proposed by Cllr Wells and seconded by Cllr Chachulski before it was unanimously:

Resolved

To delegate to the Finance Committee authority to negotiate a financial contribution to the refurbishment of each block if an agreement can be reached.

6089 Matters of Note

- Staff appraisals will be carried out in early January 2026. These will be taken to the HR Committee on 2 February 2026.
- A request for the 2026/27 precept has been made to St Albans District Council. This will be received in April (50%) and September (50%).

- The Clerk has met with officers from the District Council regarding pending asset transfers. It is expected the Jersey Farm Woodland Park transfer will complete in April 2026 and the Sandringham Crescent playground/open space in the early summer.
- 31 swift boxes have been received for installation in advance of this year's migration. 14 of these are double boxes. A bat box will also be installed at one address.

COUNCILLOR AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

6090 Grant Applications

There were no grant applications this month.

6091 Jersey Farm Woodland Park Pond

Cllr Thomas updated Members on the progress of this project. It's expected the pond creation will be complete by early February. Works will continue on the newly created butterfly and bee banks.

6092 New Climate Control for Marshalswick Community Centre/Committee Room/Parish Office

Cllr Wells updated councillors on this project. He confirmed the air conditioning units in the office, committee room and main hall were all installed and operational. Significant energy savings are expected to follow and the electricity powering the four units will be from sustainable sources.

6093 Oaklands Blossom

Members of the Planning Committee provided an overview on the 462 page application for this development of 472+ residences. Parking, transport, rights of way and the impact of additional traffic on neighbouring roads were among items discussed. It was noted the construction phase was likely to be around five years and that the Parish Council would be asked to take a lease on the proposed community centre on completion. It was proposed by Cllr Leonard, seconded by Cllr Lambert and unanimously:

Resolved

To delegate to the Planning Committee authority to respond to this early opportunity for consultation.

Cllr Chalkley informed the meeting that there will be verge tree planting carried out and funded by Herts County Council this year.




